

## History

In 1886, under the leadership of the first minister, Henry Doty Maxson, the Unitarian Society of Menomonie was organized. Reverend Maxson had a vision of the ideal church as both religious and secular. This coincided with the dreams of Andrew and Bertha Tainter to build a memorial for their daughter Mabel. The dream became the Mabel Tainter Memorial Theater and contained meeting space for the Unitarian Society. This Society disbanded in 1945. In March 1983 the Unitarian Society was re-chartered and meets today in its historic home.

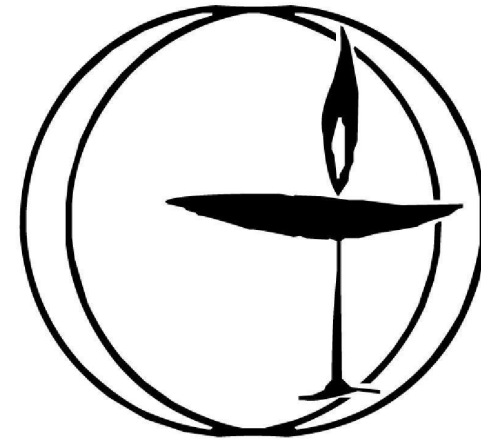
